
25 years to learn that behaviour - whether strange or appropriate - is not a question of education, but rather of relational care and attention, safety and love, or the absence of these things.

their birthdays. These former homeless women: they had come so far... from the street, from fear of themselves and others, from total isolation! And so much work! Years of work... on themselves, and with us.


■ WE NEED YOU!

MONTREAL NIGHTS AT LA RUE DES FEMMES

I'm a psychosocial support worker at La rue des Femmes's Olga House, a surprising and transformative house of healing where I've spent nearly 13 years. Time sure does fly! How do you describe this monumental journey that La rue des Femmes offers to both its staff and its participants?

Try to imagine a building in the heart of downtown, open 24 hours a day, whose walls conceal and shelter so many secrets – the worst cuts and fractures and the vilest assaults any woman can tolerate. A place where miracles happen all the time and where the staff are eager to arrive every day so they can roll up their sleeves and get to work.

For us here at LrdF, all of those hidden things that wound, fracture, wrench and even sometimes kill are not just stories we read in the newspaper. We are the ones who clean the wounds and treat the infections. And, as when treating any serious infection, it requires a delicate touch and sensitivity. I don't need to tell you that you can't just pour a bottle of disinfectant onto a deep wound and tell the patient to lower their tone immediately! You have to approach gently and wait for the person who's wounded to hold out her injured limb. You have to wait for her eyes to meet yours, so that she can see in them what she'd forgotten existed. Hope. The hope that the person in front of her, holding out her hand, doesn't want to take from her, but instead knows her suffering and knows the road to healing.

It's through my eyes that I offer my heart the first time we meet. Did you know that the most unbearable suffering – the type of suffering that can kill – is often silent or masked. It's that kind of suffering that often moves me to tears. That icy moment when she should tell... oh! this secret, this horrible event, this shame, this stain



that she sees everywhere and on everything, even on you. Or this memory that she's erased, but that makes her scream terrible things at the most inappropriate moments. But she sits there, silent, suddenly trembling, her listless eyes half closed, fixed somewhere in the past... She no longer believes in it, she hasn't for such a long time. Love. The real kind of love. The kind of love that reaches out a hand without asking for anything in return, not today and not tomorrow.

Those are the wounds that have allowed me to move beyond my own hardness, my own assumptions... Then there comes that moment of grace when, after a long and hard road, with relentless determination and patience, against all the odds, after numerous foot baths to heal the wounds, after big-sisterly laughs, after encouraging words of support – she opens her mouth and lets out a hint of a dream, a tomorrow, a maybe, a tear, as she finally looks deep into your eyes. Finally, contact has been made. Work can begin...
