THE VELAN FAMILY: A TRADITION OF COMMITMENT TO LA RUE DES FEMMES!



La Rue des Femmes' first shelter and day centre, Olga House, which was established to accommodate and care for women experiencing homelessness, celebrated its 20th anniversary on October 7. Philanthropy has been a core value for generations of the Velan family, and La rue des Femmes is privileged to be among the causes it supports.

"Twenty years already! Time flies!," recalls Tom Velan, former Chair of the Board of the Velan Foundation and a member of La rue des Femmes' Board of Directors since 2017. "I clearly recall that day, which was the culmination of a lot of hard work! And I remember how emotional and proud my mother was."

The reason that his mother, Olga Velan, was so moved on the day of the official opening is that the house at the corner of Jeanne-Mance and de la Gauchetière streets was named in her honour.

Mr. Velan continues: "For over 20 years, there has always been a member of the Velan family on the Board of La rue des Femmes. First it was my father, then my nephew, Rob [Velan], and now me. The cause of women's homelessness is dear to our hearts, because it's hard to see women in a country like Canada in such a vulnerable situation."

Mr. Velan adds that he and his father were impressed when they met Léonie: "Her determination to get women off the street permanently, to not leave anyone out there, touched us. Homelessness is much more than a housing problem! Ms. Couture understands this and the relational approach she has developed is innovative and effective. It is a major step forward in healing homelessness."

It was through a colleague who has long been involved with La rue des Femmes that Éric Filion, Executive Vice-President and Chief Operating and Customer Experience Officer at Hydro-Québec, first heard about the organization founded by Léonie Couture: "It was in 2019. I was invited to the Gala for Relational Health and to tour Olga House," he recalls. "I remember, during my visit, suddenly realizing the full extent of the distress of women living in a state of homelessness and all the challenges they face on a daily basis."

Following an enlightening meeting with the founder, president and executive director, Mr. Filion readily agreed to become Honorary Co-chair of the More than a Roof... Healing Homelessness! major fundraising campaign. "The approach based on relational health really makes the woman—the human being—the focus of the intervention," Mr. Filion says. "It goes far beyond immediate needs like shelter and food! Making the people in my circle aware of the state of homelessness, how to heal it, it and introducing them to the organization is my way of helping La rue des Femmes with its important mission."

Nearly five years ago, Catherine Op de Beeck was looking for a new challenge in the field of philanthropy. The workers' unconditional love is palpable. In fact, everyone I invite to visit one of La rue des Femmes' houses comes away with the impression of having discovered a parallel universe; a universe inhabited by love, compassion, benevolence and listening."
