Dear friends and allies, look at what La rue des Femmes has built in 30 years: three houses providing accommodation, day centres,



DAHLIA CENTRE BECOMES DORIMÈNE HOUSE

In recognition of Desjardins Group's substantial support to La rue des Femmes mission for over more than a decade, La rue des Femmes's Dahlia Centre at 1087 Anderson Street in Montréal was officially renamed Dorimène House this past fall. The building provides 12 supervised, furnished studio apartments and welcomes women who are on the path to healing and have previously stayed at La rue des Femmes's Olga House, where, having have made progress in their healing process and are ready to consider autonomous living.

Co-founder of the Desjardins Group, Dorimène Desjardins was a dedicated pioneer who perfectly embodied the great intelligence and perseverance of the women of her time and the crucial role they played, from their kitchens, in building our society's greatest model for sustainable development and economic health.

MORE THAN A ROOF... HEALING HOMELESSNESS: \$9,091,333 RAISED

The More Than a Roof... Healing Homelessness major fundraising campaign, launched in 2020 with the goal of making La rue des Femmes' most important project, the relational health institute, a reality, officially ended October 10.

Thanks to the incredible work of the campaign team, including Co-Chairs Jean-Yves Bourgeois, Executive Vice-President, Business Services, Desjardins Group; Éric Filion, Executive Vice-President, Programs and Supply Chain, Bombardier; Andrée-Lise Méthot, Founder and Managing Partner, Cycle Capital; and Maarika Paul, Executive Vice-President and Chief Financial and Operations Officer, Caisse de dépôt et placement du Québec, the initial goal of \$8 million was considerably surpassed, with \$9,091,133 finally raised.

The funds will enable us in the coming years to better understand, heal and prevent homelessness.

A future care centre

Healing homelessness demands recognition of the relational wounds caused by violence, and therefore requires access to safety, security and care. This is why one of the pillars of this major campaign is the opening of a care centre, and this facility—the only one of its kind—will open its doors in 2025 in Montréal. With the new premises, La rue des Femmes will be able to offer more hours of reconnection and rehabilitation activities, as well as additional hours of specialized and therapeutic care to women living in a state of homelessness. Eventually, the number of hours of activities and specialized care provided will increase to 10,000 from the current

4,000, meaning that 25% more women will be able to benefit from our care and services. We also plan to double the number of women accommodated, to 700 from 350.

Canada's first relational health institute

La rue des Femmes' relational health institute is this country's very first relational health research and development centre, providing curative and preventive care for women experiencing homelessness.
